**CITY ANNOUNCES DISASTER PREPAREDNESS CLASS
FOR GRADUATES OF GLENDALE UNIVERSITY**

GLENDALE, Ariz. – If a natural disaster hit Glendale, how would the city respond? How would you respond? A new class sponsored by Glendale’s Neighborhood Partnership Office will educate residents on the city’s emergency plan.

Registration is available now for this continuing education class for Glendale residents who have previously graduated from Glendale University’s series of 101 classes. This two-session graduate course is an opportunity to find out how the city prepares for emergencies and organizes in response to disasters. Students will learn about the laws, processes and issues surrounding disaster preparedness, response and recovery. In addition, the class includes valuable information about how residents can help themselves and their families during a time of crisis.

This disaster preparedness course will be held from 6 to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 30 and Thursday, March 31 at the Glendale Training Facility, 11550 W. Glendale Ave., just west of the Glendale Landfill.
