GRADUATING HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS CREATE OPENINGS ON YOUTH COMMISSION

GLENDALE, Ariz. – More than 10 vacancies have been created on the Mayor’s Youth Advisory Commission (MYAC) as a result of former members graduating from high school this past spring.

MYAC provides high school students with opportunities to make a positive impact in Glendale by getting involved in their local city government and community. The youth commission volunteers for community service activities, raises funds for projects and serves as liaison to the Mayor and City Council as the foremost voice on local youth-related issues.

Commission members must commit approximately five hours per month to attend meetings and participate in activities. Standing commission meetings are held each month at Glendale City Hall.
