IMPORTANT TRAFFIC INFORMATION FOR NFC CHAMPIONSHIP

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Cardinals fans need to be aware of suggested routes and important traffic information for the NFC Championship on Sunday, Jan. 18.

As done with all Arizona Cardinal home games, ticket holders should have a colored parking pass. There are instructions and a map on the back that will guide fans to their designated parking lot.


Parking lots open at 9 a.m. Public cash parking will be available in various lots in and around Westgate City Center and just south of the stadium at 95th Avenue and Bethany Home Road. A limited number of free overflow parking is available at the Brown Lot and Kellis High School at 91st Avenue and Orangewood (between Glendale and Northern avenues). A free shuttle service will run between the overflow lot and the stadium, beginning at 11 a.m.

Maps of parking lots and traffic routes will be available on Glendale's sports and information website - www.glendalestogame.com

To safely move pedestrians in the area, 95th Avenue west of the stadium and Maryland Avenue between 93rd and 95th Avenues will be closed to vehicle traffic.

The city of Glendale has partnered with ADOT to provide traffic information for this event. Motorists are encouraged to call **511** for updated traffic information.

In order to keep traffic moving, the Glendale Transportation Department will offer several traffic enhancements such as reversible lanes and dual turn

lanes. A reversible lane will be put in place on 91st Avenue between Camelback and Bethany Home roads. Additional turn lanes will be provided along 91st Avenue between Northern Avenue and Camelback Road. Drivers are encouraged to follow signs and use all available lanes.
