GLENDALE COLLECTS CELL PHONES TO AID DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIMS

GLENDALE, Ariz. – The city of Glendale is dialing in on a good cause with its annual cell phone recycling campaign. The campaign, which coincides with America Recycles Month, benefits domestic violence victims.

Through Nov. 30, the public is encouraged to drop off old cell phones at any of following locations:

- Glendale's three public libraries,
- the Glendale Visitor Center in downtown Glendale,
- Gate 3 of Jobing.com Arena, located on the northwest corner of the building, and at
- Glendale Community College.

All phones collected in Glendale will benefit the West Valley Advocacy Center which serves victims of domestic violence. On average, more than 500 phones a year are turned over to the center which is able to have the phones refurbished or recycled for cash. Refurbished phones are programmed so victims of stalking and domestic violence will have a means of dialing 9-1-1 if threatened. Money collected for non-working phones is used to fund toys for children, hotel stays, taxi rides or to provide other services to keep victims out of harm's way.

According to the Cellular Telecommunications and Internet Association, cell phones are replaced after approximately 18-months of use. As many as 150 million phones a year are disposed of annually.
