RECYCLE YOUR ELECTRONICS AT GLENDALE'S E-WASTE EVENT SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 7

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Got a new TV for Christmas or your big Super Bowl party coming up? Don't throw your old one away! Give it a second life at Glendale's e-waste event on Saturday, Feb. 7.

With the digital television transition just days away, the city of Glendale is encouraging residents to recycle their outdated analog set, rather than sending it to take up space in the landfill unnecessarily.


Many old electronics' parts can be recycled and used in manufacturing new and refurbished electronic products, thereby creating less waste.

“This year, with the impending DTV transition, there has been a slight increase of televisions being thrown away. While that is a safe option, we want to offer residents another option which is more environmentally responsible” says Field Operations Director Stuart Kent.

Bring your outdated, unwanted or even non-working electronics to the west side of Sahuaro Ranch Park, to the entrance off of 63rd Avenue adjacent to the softball fields. Items will be accepted between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. one day only on Feb. 7. The e-waste event will accept any type of electronics for recycling, but Glendale residents must show proof of residency; i.e. water bill or driver license with Glendale address.
