The recent rains and cooler temperatures make for ideal conditions to start those gardening projects that have been on hold during the long summer months.

- Understanding & Maintaining Your Landscape Watering System: Saturday, Sept. 27
Learn the basics about your water system – drip, bubblers, or sprinklers. This class provides a basic overview and includes how watering systems are designed, how to repair common leaks, and tips on how to set the controller/timer. Understanding your watering system will keep your plants healthy, your system running efficiently, and can lower your water costs.
- The Basics of Seed Saving: Saturday, Oct. 4
Discover ways to prevent unwanted cross-pollination and learn seed-saving techniques for common garden vegetables. This class is offered through a partnership with the Valley Permaculture Alliance.
