FREE VEGETABLE GARDENING AND SEED SAVING CLASS

Glendale, Ariz. — Are you interested in growing vegetables at home? Whether you are a seasoned gardener or just beginning, you will find a bounty of information at the Vegetable Gardening and Seed Saving class on Saturday, Feb. 16 at the Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown St.

This free class is divided into two sections:

Between noon and 1 p.m. local organic farmer, Frank Martin from Crooked Sky Farms, explains how to grow vegetables organically and provides recommendations for native seeds to use for home gardens.

From 1 - 2 p.m. the Valley Permaculture Alliance provides information on how you can be a part of future community seed swaps at the Glendale Main Library. Maricopa County Master Gardeners will add to the team of local experts on hand to help answer your questions.
