GLENDALE POSTS ONLINE SURVEY FOR PARKS & RECREATION MASTER PLAN UPDATE

GLENDALE, Ariz. -- Residents are encouraged to provide feedback on future parks and recreation facilities and services by participating in an online survey as part of an update to Glendale's Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Input from residents, local interest groups, community organizations and businesses and public officials will be critical to help establish priorities for current and future parks and recreation services, programs and facilities offered within the city of Glendale. Many changes have occurred since the 2002 Glendale Parks and Recreation Master Plan was adopted. The online survey is part of an update and a 10-month process that will result in a detailed "road map" to identify community priorities and outline a plan of action.

The survey is provided for residents to express their opinions regarding the department, as well as whether facilities and current programs are meeting the needs of residents.
