Bring the kids too, to learn how solar energy works and take part in fun solar activities. This event is hosted by the Conservation and Sustainable Living Office and will be held on Saturday, Mar. 9, 10 a.m. to noon, at the Glendale Main Library, 5959 W. Brown St.

APS will provide a presentation, “Energy Efficiency and Solar,” at 10:30a.m. and a second presentation, “The Pros and Cons of Going Solar,” at 11 a.m. Outdoor displays will include the Arizona Solar Cookers and Glendale’s Watt Watchers youth education program with solar energy activities for kids. Glendale residents who attend the event will be given free energy-saving devices. This event, including free energy devices, is funded by an Energy Conservation Block Grant from the US Department of Energy.

Glendale Solar Day is an official event of the state-wide Arizona SciTech Festival, a celebration of science and technology held annually in February and March. To highlight events in Glendale and the West Valley, families can make a fun experience with Glendale’s Passport to Science, a new concept developed to encourage the public to take part in many of these free educational, hands-on events.
