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TAMARAC HOA AT MARYLAND LAKES AWARDED NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT GRANT

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Neighbors living in the Tamarac HOA at Maryland Lakes, 4824 W. Sierra Vista Drive, will receive a grant of nearly \$27,000 for the installation of decorative lighting to be located within the neighborhood’s common areas.

The Citizen’s Advisory Commission on Neighborhoods awarded the funds to the neighbors who have agreed to provide sweat equity to offset the cost of the project. They will work through the city’s Community Volunteer Program.

The Tamarac HOA is a registered neighborhood, located between 47th to 49th avenues, Ocotillo Road to the north and Maryland Avenue to the south. It lists 49 households in the property that is more than 20 years old.

“The project is another great partnership between the City of Glendale and the residents,” said Larry Flatau, chair of the Citizen’s Advisory Commission on Neighborhoods. “This community, which is struggling with an aging infrastructure, was able to leverage their HOA fees with the city’s grant funds to begin the first step in revitalization.”

The Neighborhood Partnership Office administers a grant program that funds revitalization projects twice a year to assist neighborhoods more than 15 years old. Citizen participation and involvement are key components of the program.
