TV SHOW FEATURES ARIZONA LEADERS SPEAKING AGAINST TOHONO O'ODHAM RESERVATION


GLENDALE, Ariz. – Television viewers can watch Glendale 11 TV to hear local, state, national and Native American leaders discuss their opposition to a proposed Indian reservation by the Tohono O'odham Indian Tribe.

Glendale Mayor Elaine Scruggs and City Attorney Craig Tindall were part of a panel invited to give their views at the Glendale Chamber of Commerce's lunch, Aug. 10 at the Renaissance Glendale Hotel and Spa. Other local leaders who spoke against the casino included Diane Enos, president of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, Rick Bistow, deputy chief of the Arizona Attorney General's Office and U.S. Representative Trent Franks.

The city, state of Arizona, 12 Indian tribes and congressional leaders are against the Tohono O'odham's desire to turn land at 91st and Northern Avenues into an Indian reservation for the purpose of developing it into a casino. It is the position of these various groups that the Tribe's application is poor public policy and violates governmental rights, privileges and authority of the city, state and county.
