The fall series of Glendale University includes ten classes scheduled between Sept. 11 and Nov. 13 from 6 to 8:30 p.m. at a variety of city locations. In order to graduate from the course, students must attend at least eight of the ten classes. Each class will highlight a key function of the city including, but not limited to, finance, public works, code compliance, library services and public safety.
