**GLENDALE, Ariz.** – Glendale residents are invited to attend a free legislative program at the capitol designed specifically for neighborhood leaders.

The eighth annual Neighborhood Day at the State Legislature will be held, 9:30 a.m. – 2 p.m. Wednesday, January 24 at the Capitol Mall, 1700 W. Washington St. Transportation will be provided from downtown Glendale to the Capitol and back, along with a free box lunch.

Neighborhood Day will begin with a morning reception at the Glendale Civic Center featuring Glendale Mayor Elaine Scruggs, along with a brief overview of legislative issues impacting neighborhoods. Refreshments will be served.

Following the morning reception, Glendale participants will take a chartered bus to the Capitol where they will enjoy a free lunch while having the opportunity to hear from other key legislative leaders.

In addition, residents will have an opportunity to talk to their own state legislators, tour the Arizona House of Representatives and Senate and learn about the 2007 neighborhood legislative agenda.
