Holiday Iris Paper Folding Craft

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Here’s a foolproof craft for the “all thumbs” wannabe adult crafter! Iris folding is a fun and easy paper folding technique that can be used to make greeting cards, on scrapbook pages or designs that can be framed and hung on the wall.

“Iris Paper Folding” will be offered at 10 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 6 at Velma Teague Branch Library 7010 N. 58th Ave. The technique started in Holland and is called iris folding because the center of the design resembles the iris of a camera or eye. Traditionally, origami paper is used for the main design and holographic paper is used to fill in the center of the design.

The library project is a holiday card using the iris folding technique.
