GLENDALE SEEKS INPUT ON POSSIBLE ZONING ORDINANCE CHANGES

Donation Drop Boxes, Flagpole Regulations and Other Amendments Under Consideration

GLENDALE, Ariz. – Glendale’s Planning Division is holding a neighborhood meeting to discuss possible amendments to city zoning ordinances that would regulate the placement and location of donation drop boxes and revise current flagpole height regulations.

Other potential zoning amendments under discussion include changes to various city ordinances proposed by public members, a proposal allowing electronic message signs for churches, along with new definitions regarding medical marijuana facilities to comply with state law.

Gathering community feedback is the first step in the Zoning Text Amendment process. Residents are welcomed and encouraged to provide input.
