TRIBUTE TO ARIZONA'S FALLEN COMES TO GLENDALE PUBLIC LIBRARY
Glendale hosts "Remembering Our Fallen" Exhibit Aug. 12-25

(GLENDALE, Ariz.) July 25, 2013: Since the start of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, many Arizona service men and women have given their lives in defense of our country. West Valley residents are invited to view an emotionally moving tribute to the Arizonans who made the supreme sacrifice in these wars.

The Honor Walk Foundation and the city of Glendale are proud to bring the "Remembering Our Fallen" exhibit to the Glendale Public Library from Aug. 12 through 25. Comprised of five 10-foot panels, the traveling exhibit features photos, biographical information and personal mementos of the Arizona residents who died serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom.

The exhibit will be located inside the Main branch of the Glendale Public Library, 5959 W. Brown St. Visitors can view the exhibit during regular library hours: Monday and Wednesday, from 1 to 8 p.m.; Tuesday and Thursday, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Saturday, noon to 5 p.m.; and Sunday, 1 to 5 p.m. The library is closed on Fridays.

An opening ceremony for the exhibit will be held Monday, Aug. 12. A color guard and brief program, led by Glendale Mayor Jerry Weiers, will begin at 1:30 p.m.

"It's important to remember the sacrifices made by our military, especially the Arizonans who have lost their lives in Iraq and Afghanistan," said Mayor Weiers. "We are pleased that Glendale can help honor the memories of these brave Americans."

"Remembering Our Fallen is a moving patriotic tribute to the Arizona citizen soldiers who gave their lives in Iraq and Afghanistan," said Honor Walk Foundation Director Denis Day.
