Be Transported to the Renaissance in a Recorder Performance at Foothills Branch Library

GLENDALE, Ariz. – The Utopia Road Recorder Consort will perform at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 3 at Foothills Branch Library, 19055 N. 57th Ave.

Recorders have been popular instruments since the 10th century in Europe. By 1750, recorders were replaced in orchestras by more powerful transverse flutes. Recorders have seen a surge in popularity since the early 1900s because they are relatively easy to play.

Director Linda Rising says that the group is made up of Renaissance wannabes who gather to play and sing just for fun and perform a few times each year. They will play a variety of music from medieval to contemporary, played on replica instruments from the 15th and 16th centuries.
